COMMUNITY SUPPORT SERVICES

One-on-one, hourly supports assisting adults with disabilities to live independently in their home and be included in their community

Supported Community Living

For adults with any disability or mental illness who are not Medicaid eligible

Home Habilitation

For adults with a mental illness/brain health diagnosis such as Anxiety, Depression, Schizophrenia, Bipolar Disorder as well as Autism and eligible for Medicaid funding

HCBS Waiver Services - ID/BI

For adults with intellectual disabilities (ID) or Brain Injury (BI) and eligible for Medicaid Waiver funding

Senior Services

Hourly in-home supports for adults over 65, either private pay or Medicaid-funded CDAC. This service is not for training but instead to provide supports for seniors to remain safely in their home instead of a higher level of care

EMPLOYMENT SUPPORT SERVICES

Supports provided to adults and transition aged youth with disabilities to obtain and maintain integrated employment in the community

Small Group Supported Employment

Based at the Waverly Trinkets & Togs, clients participate in paid work experience as part of their journey to community employment

Individual Supported Employment

Working with individuals to explore, obtain and maintain employment in the community. Connecting with local businesses to fill employment gaps

Vocational Rehabilitation (IVRS)

Community Rehab Provider for IVRS providing work experience, exploration, development and coaching to obtain and maintain community employment

Pre-Vocational Career Exploration

Pre-vocational service to assist Medicaid-eligible individuals to determine if employment services is the desired path

Trinkets & Togs Thrift Stores exist to further the mission of The Larrabee Center

Retail Services

With locations in Waverly, Grundy Center and Cedar Falls, Trinkets & Togs operates solely on donations from the community and revenues from the sale of goods support our agency mission

Work Experience & Volunteers

High school special education students with and without disabilities volunteer at the thrift store to gain valuable work experience completing various duties. Community members and groups also volunteer to support our mission either for one-time projects or on a regular basis.

Recycling/Community Connections

Items that do not sell or are not in sellable condition may be recycled including clothing, shoes, metals, plastics, etc. Additionally, connections are made with other organizations to give back to the community
